

Chemin des Outaouais Route

- Walking Trail along the Ottawa River approx. 240 kms over a period of 12 day (stages)
- There are 25 departures from Ottawa between May 25th to June 18th and limited to 6 hikers per group (max of 150 hikers per season).
- You are provided with an itinerary by the organizing committee (available in English and French) which articulates the directions you walk, where you stay overnight and what places you can stop and rest along the way.
- $\circ\,$ Cost is \$80 to register for the walk.
- There is an information or orientation day in April in Gatineau (this has already occurred on April 2nd)
- Unlike the Camino your accommodations are predetermined and you pay \$20 per each overnight stay (11 overnight accommodations). I think there maybe one or two accommodations costing \$30 this year.

Chemin des Outaouais Route

- The path is marked where allowed but its best to use the itinerary directions (which are quite detailed) as the markers are few and far between.
- I would consider this an easy walk as it is a relatively flat route and most of the walk is along paths or secondary roads.
- The route crosses the Ottawa river 3 times via ferry boats (cost of \$2 per person for each ferry boat ride)
- Important to stop at the grocery stores (where available) at the start of the day to purchase your midday lunch as not many options along the way.
- This is an excellent route/option if you want to determine if you like Camino hiking
 - $\circ\,$ it is short (relatively),
 - $\circ\,$ accommodation is provided,
 - relatively inexpensive
 - $\circ\,$ and its in your backyard!

Day 1 Ottawa to Orleans

Starting Point is the Notre Dame Basilica, Ottawa for an 8 am departure

Distance 20.4 Kms

Path takes you;

- by Rideau Hall and PM Residence
- through Rockcliffe E Park and the Rockeries
- then along the Ottawa River
- before stopping at the Aviation Museum.
- then back along the Parkway to the path along the Ottawa River
- then a bike Path then into Orleans





End Point is St. Joseph Church in Orleans

Accommodation is the basement of the church with your sleeping bag on a thin Gym Mattresses

Washroom with sinks and toilet available but no shower which was available at a nearby YMCA (the YMCA has been sold and is no longer available)




Distance 17.2 Kms Path takes you;

- via Old Montreal Road into the town Cumberland
- The Black Walnut Bakery in Cumberland
- Cumberland to Masson Ferry Boat ride into Quebec
- walk through Masson and into Buckingham
















End Point is the Farmhouse run by the Sisters of St. Mary of Manur

- our accommodation is a farmhouse owned by the Sisters of Saint Mary of Manur.
- Late afternoon Vesper Service in the main building with the nuns.
- The farmhouse is no longer available with the accommodation now being moved to the Mason Arena



Distance 20.3 Kms

Path takes you;

- Out of Buckingham then a series of country roads including a
 Chemin Rest Stop on Rue Linda where the owner offered Tea and a history of the early Scottish settlers.
- Visit the old Scottish cemetery
- #16 Montee Berndt Chemin Rest stop – Garage with a pay per use refrigerator
- Organic farmer "Our Little Farm" providing an organic vegetable box service to locals
- Then into Thurso home to Guy Lafleur













End Point is the St. Jean the Evangelist Church in Thurso

- our accommodation is in the building adjoining the church
- We experienced a hail storm with an accompanying Tornado Warning



Day 4 Thurso to Plaisance

Distance 19.1 Kms Path takes you;

- Out of Thurso
- Past the Guy Lafleur Arena.
- Down a bike path then along several rural roads to Chute Plaisance
- Stopped at the visitor centre at the Chute (toilets and Picnic tables)
- Then into the town of Plaisance



Distance 23.4 Kms Path takes you;

- Out of Plaisance then along some country roads
- Chemin Rest Stop #218 Rang St. Joseph West. Farmhouse with barn with horse and goats
- Cross under Hwy 50
- Walk through the Montebello Golf Course
- Into the town of Montebello

Day 6 Montebello to L'Orignal

Distance 23.9 Kms (longest distance of the Chemin)

Path takes you;

- Out of Montebello
- To the Fassett to Lefaivre Ferry (we took a taxi to other side due to the flooding)
- Along the Ottawa River with a few stops at designated Chemin Rest Stops
- Then into the historic town of L'Orignal



- our accommodation is in a camping centre building with a shower in a separate building in the camp ground.
- Beds were the gym mattresses on the floor
- Food was available via a take out service that delivered into the campground.

- Out of L'Orignal along the river
- Into Hawkesbury

End Point is the Community Centre in Chute a Blondeau

- We were met and greeted by Johanne on the street. She came well prepared with a cooler pack filled with Sangria and a couple of plates of snacks including cheese, meat slices, crackers and some sliced vegies.
- We preordered our meal the night before while in L'Orignal with an option for Vegan and Gluten Free Pasta.

Distance 22.7 Kms Path takes you;

- Out of Chute a Blondeau along the river


- Along secondary Roads (a bit boring walk)

End Point is the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes in Rigaud.

- Our accommodation is in the basement (lower level) of the Gift Shop at the Sanctuary
- We had actual beds which was a nice change from the thin Gym Mattresses we have been accustomed to
- Supper was a walk back into town with lots of good restaurant options.
- Sanctuary was a beautiful place to visit.



Distance 16.4 Kms Path takes you;

- Out of Rigaud along the river.
- Numerous gorgeous houses along the river
- Then into Hudson


















End Point is the St. Thomas Church in Hudson. Note previously the destination was in Oka however due to flooding it was switched to Hudson.

- Our accommodation is in the basement of the church with showers in the main house.
- Our host was Father Roland Demers who treated us to an afternoon Tea at 2:30 pm
- We attended his bilingual afternoon mass were he made reference to our pilgrimage in his prayers.
- We walked to the Auberge Willow Inn for supper and Father Demers picked us up and drove us back to the church.

Distance 19.9 Kms Path takes you;

- Then walk through Oka and then along the river and then follow a fairly long walking and bike path to Sainte Marthe Sur le Lac

- The rooms were extremely hot as temperatures were in the 30's that day and with only one fan to in the hallway to provide some ventilation.




Day 11 Sainte Marthe Sur le Lac to Laval



- Our host was Sister Mariette DesRochers. Another wonderful host.




Day 12 Laval to St. Joseph Oratory, Montreal

- Leading to the End Point of the walk - The St. Joseph Oratory





- We arranged to get our last stamps on our Chemin passports.

- Accommodation is possible at the Oratory otherwise about a one hour walk to train station

Chemin des Outaouais

- $\circ\,$ The Chemin des Outaouais is one of several hiking paths in the province of Quebec
- The other main walking routes are;
- Chemin des Sanctuaires 375 kms (18 days) from the St. Joseph Oratory in Montreal to the Basilica in Sainte Anne-de-Beaupre
- Chemin de Navigateurs 400 kms (21 days) from Sainte Anne-de-la-Pointe-au-Pere to Sainte Anne-de-Beaupre
- Chemin de l'Acadie 400 kms (20 days) from Sainte Anne-de-la-Pointe-au-Pere to Sainte Anne-du-Bocage, Caraquet N.B
- $\circ\,$ There are also several other shorter routes available
